

Our Diamond Anniversaries

Saint Michael Lutheran School just completed their 60^{th} School Year and Saint Michael Lutheran Church will celebrate its 75^{th} Anniversary on the weekend of September 24-25 (Our actual birthday is September 29, the day the Christian Church celebrates Saint Michael and All Angels – from whence we received our name). Some of you know our history well, for others of you this will be new, but we share it knowing that if God has brought us this far, He will carry us through to the end.

Saint Michael's story begins near the turn of the century when traveling missionaries visited Fort Myers and discussed the possibility of starting a congregation here. The challenge was that no bridge spanned the Caloosahatchee, so transportation was by boat only. It was not until 1931, and the completion of the Edison Bridge, that Lutherans renewed their efforts in this area. The city was canvassed and worship services started with an average of 7 in attendance. This initial community was not sustainable.

It wasn't until 1939, when Rev. H.E. Hartman (from Trinity Lutheran in Delray Beach) led a delegation of 38 Walther Leaguers (young adults) to Fort Myers to call on 800 families. They helped organize a new Lutheran Mission and the District assigned a full-time missionary in 1940.

In September 1941, Rev. Art Weber arrived to lead the small congregation. On September 29, 1941 Saint Michael Evangelical Lutheran Church of Fort Myers was officially chartered. And within 6 months, the members dedicated their first sanctuary on the northwest corner of Grand and Lafayette.

By 1953, the little church was sold and a new sanctuary was constructed on the southwest corner of McGregor and Coconut. In 1956, Kindergarten classes were begun and Saint Michael Lutheran School was established. By 1964 the school had grown to a complete 9-grade elementary parochial school.

The final move came when our current Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall (now the Office Center) were built on the southwest corner of Broadway and Carrell in 1968. The Education Building (school building) followed in 1978. In 1994 the Anderson/Eichler Fine Arts and Athletic Center was constructed and then the Early Learning Center was added.

As the oldest Missouri Synod congregation in southwest Florida, Saint Michael has had the privilege and opportunity to daughter 7 congregations: Good Shepherd (North Fort Myers), Zion (South Fort Myers), Grace (Naples), Bethlehem (East Fort Myers), Trinity (Cape Coral), Beautiful Savior (Lehigh Acres), and establishing the Lutheran Church in the Dominican Republic.

As we look back over the past 75 years, we stand in awe of the blessings that God has showered on us and through us. Over the years the Lord of the Church has blessed this congregation with a passion for people (both within our church and those in our community and beyond), for families, for education, for youth, for outreach and acts of kindness and caring. We now stand in the succession of that long line of people who loved their Lord and loved and served others. And that ongoing adventure of being the church in this place continues to lie before us.

From Our Parish Nurse

As school is starting here are some tips to help prevent medical errors in children, which is taken from an article by Eileen S. O'Neill, PhD, RN. *PROTECTING PATIENT SAFETY: PREVENTING MEDICAL ERRORS*.

Be involved in your child's healthcare

1. The single most important way you can help prevent errors is to be an active member of your child's healthcare team.

Medicines

2. Make sure that all of your child's doctors know everything your child is taking and his or her weight. This includes over the counter meds and vitamins or herbs.

3. Make sure your child's doctor knows about any allergies and how your child reacts to medicines.

4. When your doctor writes a prescription, make sure you can read it. Make sure that you receive the correct medicine prior to leaving the pharmacy. Ask for information about your child's medicine in terms you can understand.

Hospital Stays

5. Ask all healthcare workers who have direct contact with your child whether they have washed their hands.

6. When your child is being discharged, ask the doctor/nurse to explain the treatment plan you will use at home.

Surgery

7. Make sure that you, your child's doctor, and the surgeon all agree and are clear on exactly what will be done.

Other steps you can take

8. Speak up if you have any concerns

9. Make sure you know who is in charge of your child's care. Make sure that they have important healthcare information about your child.

10. Ask a family member or friend to be there with you to be your advocate. Choose someone who can help get things done and speak for you if you can't.

11. If your child has a test, ask when the results will be available.
