From the Pastor

I don't know how many of you remember the movie "City Slickers", but there's a great scene where Billy Crystal's character, Mitch, is alone with Curly, played by Jack Palance, and Curly is giving Mitch some advice about life and he says, "Do you know what the secret of life is?" And he holds up one finger and says, "This." To which Mitch responds, "The secret of life is your finger?" And Curly says, "No – it's one thing; just one thing…" And Mitch asks, "But, what is the 'one thing'?" And Curly answers, "That's what you have to find out."

At the end of this month we will celebrate the **Reformation** again and we want to get to that one thing, the main thing, because it is the purpose of our congregation, it is what we've been called to proclaim and if we miss this one thing, if we don't get this right, no matter what else we do, no matter how good any program or ministry effort might look – we've failed. And by the way, we don't get to choose or decide what this main thing is – it is that one central truth that God has revealed to us.

The apostle Paul talks about this in Colossians 1:28-29, where he writes, "We proclaim Him, we proclaim Jesus, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ. To this end I strenuously contend with all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me." Do you see it? We proclaim Jesus – that God has saved us in Jesus by His grace alone through faith alone - we proclaim Jesus.

And that means that we don't proclaim human insights; we don't proclaim selfimprovement or stress-management or life balance or career enhancement; we don't proclaim a political agenda; we don't proclaim a set of traditions – we proclaim Jesus! Because He is the light of the world; He is the creator and sustainer of all that exists; He is the Head of the Church, the Kingdom bringer and sin bearer and death defeater and life giver. And when you have received Him by God's grace through faith – He touches a place in your soul that nothing else can touch.

And when we say that we proclaim Jesus we're saying as Paul did in 2 Corinthians 5:18-21, that God was in Jesus reconciling the world to Himself, not counting people's sins against them but laying those sins on the One who knew no sin so that in Jesus we might become the righteousness of God. That's the one thing; that's the thing that we're betting the farm on, that's what we're staking our lives on – we are devoting ourselves fully to the crucified carpenter of Nazareth – we proclaim Jesus! And we proclaim Him to everyone.

So if someone should ask what the focus of our congregation is – are we focused mostly on people outside of the church or those inside of the church? The answer is "yes"! God loves everybody whether they're inside or out! We want people outside to be

drawn to know Jesus as their Savior and we want people inside to grow up in Him – to know Him better & love Him more & live for Him.

And by the way, the Apostle Paul knew that the best way for Jesus to be spread to other people who don't know Him as Savior is when those people see Jesus in us and hear about Him from us. And again, we seek to do that, to proclaim Jesus, to everyone. And so my dear friends, the most important thing is for us to be in Jesus and for Jesus to be in us.

Part of what our Biblical heritage is from the Reformation is that we all have been gifted by our God to be involved in this great mission of bringing the world to Jesus and Jesus to the world! And each and every one of us is involved in this great adventure! So, thanks for being a part of our Saint Michael family as together we seek to make an eternal difference!

Early detection and diagnosis of breast cancer increase one's likelihood of survival. There is no sure way to prevent it, but there are things you can do that might lower your risk such as changing risk factors that are under your control including alcohol consumption (risk increases with amount consumed), obesity, physical activity (especially after menopause), not having children, not breast feeding, birth control, hormone therapy after menopause and breast implants.

Inside Baseball

"Behold, You desire truth in the innermost being" Psalm 51:6.

Sometimes in the midst of correcting your kids, you can easily lose sight of the main reason you discipline them in the first place. It's not just to get their clothes picked up or to eat the meal you've prepared or to stop hitting a sibling. The reason for discipline is to develop inner character, the kind that knows and is learning how to respond to life's challenges.

The core of a baseball is made of hard rubber. But imagine if the core were marshmallow. What would happen as the string wrapped around it or when a bat smacked it hard several times? It would smush into a mess. It's the inside that counts—

the character you're growing in your children. As life begins to happen, as circumstances and decisions begin to wrap around them, it's their character that will hold them together.

Barbara and I define character as "response-ability"—the ability to make the right choices in response to authority and to life's circumstances. From the time your children leave the cradle, your work as a parent is to turn life situations into teaching situations, growing their "response-ability" one day at a time, teaching them how to respond to you, to others, to life, and to God.

In the next few days, you'll have plenty of opportunities either to overreact to your children's behavior or to address the roots of their development—to deal with externals or to train their hearts. Remember, you're growing character here. It's only the ones who grow strong at the center—especially as character is strengthened by commitment to God's Word—who are able to hold up to the challenges they will face in life.

The Lutheran Service Book - An Amazing Resource

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

Part of my seminary training includes an intentional increase in daily prayer and devotions. With that, I wanted to take a minute to talk about the incredible gift we have in our LSB, the hymnal that we use in the sanctuary. If you have ever taken some time to check it out, you will likely agree that it contains not only the information for worship, but a wealth of devotional material as well. The hymns themselves are great texts for devotions. The indexes can be used to focus on particular topics you may be thinking (trust, hope and comfort,

sanctification, etc) and the lyrics composed are so rich and deep that each hymn may be used as a devotion in itself. What I have found particularly helpful in my personal devotions are the Psalms in the front of the hymnal. Luther loved the Psalms as part of his daily devotion, and the original melodies are even printed in the front for singing them (which is my preferred method). I personally love the Psalter, as it simply has the Psalms, their melodies, and prayers interspersed that connect them to Jesus. I received it as a gift from a dear friend and it is one of those books that is always in my brief case. In any case, I encourage you to pick up a hymnal from Concordia Publishing House for your use at home. They also offer it digitally on the various e-reading services. I have it on my phone, and it is a blessing all the time. I hope and pray this can be a resource for you in your daily devotions, as well! God's richest blessings on your month!

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Habitat for Humanity's Disaster Recovery Critical Home Repair Program

There are still many people in Lee and Hendry Counties whose homes were impacted by Hurricane Irma and who do not have the means to repair their homes. In addition to its home ownership program, Habitat for Humanity of Lee and Hendry Counties now has a Disaster Recovery Program to help low-income homeowners.

The Disaster Recovery Program is funded from many generous donors and grantors. Disaster affected homeowners are asked to participate as they are able but are not required to physically volunteer, and only have to make a small financial contribution to the repair based on their means. The program can help

seniors on fixed incomes as well as families, as long as they own their single family home, are current on their mortgage if they have one, and earn less than 80% of the area median income (100% if they are a veteran or disabled.) In addition to home repair assistance, Habitat for Humanity has a case worker who can help disaster affected people with other issues they may face as well, thanks to a grant from FEMA and Lee County.

To begin the application process, please go to **www.habitat4humanity.org** to print and complete the Home Repair Intake Form. Forms may be returned to Habitat for Humanity of Lee and Hendry Counties, 1288 N. Tamiami Trail, North Fort Myers, FL 33903 or emailed to DisasterRecovery@habitat4humanity.org. Once they review your Intake Form, a Disaster Recovery Case Manager will contact you. If you are eligible for Habitat's repair program, you will be invited to complete the Disaster Recovery Critical Home Repair Application.
