From the Pastor

"So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in Him, rooted and built up in Him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." (Colossians 2:6-7)

It's that time of the year – school is back in session, Sunday School, confirmation instruction, Bible Classes are all being re-energized for a season of growing in our faith and in our relationship with our Savior Jesus. It really is all about our life with Jesus, following Jesus each day, and becoming involved in God's redemptive and restoring mission.

And as you can see in the passage above, our life in Jesus and with Jesus started with Him. Out of His love and grace for us, He comes to us, calls us, chooses us, and makes us His own. He does that for a purpose, as Paul reminds us in Galatians 2:20, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

Again, our school's theme is "Made to Love, Called to Serve" – our "calling", sometimes referred to as our "vocation", is to serve. Each and every one of us as followers of Jesus are called by God to be particular people, in particular places, with particular opportunities to love and serve. In other words, God gives us specific people to love and influence, specific places to dwell in as His witnesses.

It's about "becoming like Jesus", or as we have been sharing over these summer weekends, it's about having "Christ formed in us." And what that looks like is our having an increasing capacity to love others as we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. Jesus said in John 13:35, "By this will all people know that you are My disciples, if you love one another."

So, the evidence of being a follower of Jesus is not our knowledge of theology, or our attention to keeping rules, or our time spent in church, the evidence is our increasing capacity for loving others. Becoming like Jesus looks like serving others with love. And not some sappy kind of love given only to the loveable, but

a gritty kind of love that is redemptive and restoring and that does its best work in the midst of anger, hatred, ruin and opposition – in a word, it's grace.

Grace is loving the unlovable; treating people better than they deserve – in the same way that God treats us. So, becoming like Jesus looks like grace, which is beyond our own ability – that's why we need

Jesus ourselves, because the love we want to share is the love that has come to us from God in our Savior. Here's our chance this month to do THE most important thing in our life in Jesus, as Paul says in Galatians 5:6, "The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love."

Taking Care of your Mental Health

In March and April of this year I worked together with the Neuropsychiatric Research Center and screened people for cognitive and memory concerns. The screening did not constitute a diagnosis, but for those who had scores lower than the norm, referrals were made and resources given. If you would like to be screened, please call the church office and ask them to put you in touch with me so I can set up an appointment for you.

So, how do you rate your mental health? NAMI is the National Alliance on Mental Illness. There are offices in our local counties where you can seek assistance.

Some warning signs that you may need to seek help or help someone else include but are not limited to: excessive worry or fear, confused thinking or problems concentrating and learning, extreme mood changes, including uncontrollable 'highs' or feelings of euphoria, prolonged or strong feelings of irritability or anger, avoiding friends or social activities, difficulties understanding or relating to other people, difficulty perceiving reality, multiple physical ailments without obvious cause, thinking about suicide, abuse of substances like alcohol or drugs.

Once you find the right specialist, prior to your first appointment be sure to write down your issues and be ready to talk about your health history and what you are experiencing. Ask about treatment options so that you understand the plan and what you need to do. Be sure to ask all your questions. Stay involved with friends and family and your church. Keep a wellness log to monitor your progress. Stay positive and surround yourself with positive messages, people and activities. This will help you feel better.

Did you know that the Bible has 365 "Fear Not's," one for each day of the year?

Philippians 4:6 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.'

There is a hymn that says,' I know not what the future holds, but I know who holds the future'. We should remember this and pray often asking God to help us.




An Open Letter to My Porn Watching Dad

Dear Dad,

I want to let you know first of all that I love you and forgive you for what this has done in my life. I also wanted to let you know exactly what your porn use has done to my life. You may think that this effects only you, or even your and mom's relationships. But it has had a profound impact on me and all of my siblings as well.

I found your porn on the computer somewhere around the age of 12 or so, just when I was starting to become a young woman. First of all, it seemed very hypocritical to me that you were trying to teach me the value of what to let into my mind in terms of





As far as modesty goes, you tried to talk with me about how my dress affects those around me and how I should value myself for what I am on the inside. Your actions however told me that I would only ever truly be beautiful and accepted if I looked like the women on magazine covers or in porn. Your talks with me meant nothing and in fact, just made me angry.

As I grew older, I only had this message reinforced by the culture we live in. That beauty is something that can only be achieved if you look like "them". I also learned to trust you less and less as what you told me didn't line up with what you did. I wondered more and more if I would ever find a man who would accept me and love me for me and not just a pretty face.

When I had friends over, I wondered how you perceived them. Did you see them as my friends, or did you see them as a pretty face in one of your fantasies? No girl should ever have to wonder that about the man who is supposed to be protecting her and other women in her life.

I did meet a man. One of the first things I asked him about was his struggle with pornography. I'm thankful to God that it is something that hasn't had a grip on his life. We still have had struggles because of the deep-rooted distrust in my heart for men. Yes, your porn watching has affected my relationship with my husband years later.

If I could tell you one thing, it would be this: Porn didn't just affect your life; it affected everyone around you in ways I don't think you can ever realize. It still affects me to this day as I realize the hold that it has on our society. I dread the day when I have to talk with my sweet little boy about pornography and its far-reaching greedy hands. When I tell him about how pornography, like most sins, affects far more than just us.

Like, I said, I have forgiven you. I am so thankful for the work that God has done in my life in this area. It is an area that I still struggle with from time to time, but I am thankful for God's grace and also my husband's. I do pray that you are past this and that the many men who struggle with this will have their eyes opened.

In the opening verse of the hymn, the lyrics call to mind the sacrifice of Jesus and how He Himself bore the weight of our sin and shame on the cross selflessly for the whole world. He did it alone and scorned by those who He came to save "offered mercy's perfect deed." Now, out of response to that great love, we as servants bring the worship – but this is not worship of mere words. This is worship that comes from the heart. 
Sunday School Help Needed
