In February our thoughts turn very naturally to LOVE! And what an incredible "God-incident" it is that Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year! 1 John 3:16 says, "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down His life for us." And John goes on to say in 4:9-10, "This is how God showed H is love among us: He sent His One and Only Son into the world that we might live through Him, This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

Now, it's no surprise that everyone needs love; I mean, we all need love, but what we may not realize is that we all need to also **give** love as well. There is a famine in our world today that has left everyone starving for love. And beyond that, people have a need to feel forgiven, to experience security, and to have hope for the future; all of our other needs flow from these four.

And one of the things almost everyone comes to realize sooner or later is – **no one person can satisfy these needs.** Nobody can love you as much as you need to be loved; nobody can give you forgiveness like you need to feel forgiven; security doesn't come from people, circumstances, or things; and hope has to be more than just another person saying that everything is going to work out all right, so don't worry.

This great famine all around us, and maybe even in some of us, can only be quenched at one place – **the foot of the cross!** That's the place where God said, "You are loved!" And it is only in the light of that love that you can begin to love yourself and start to reach out to others around you in love. People all around you are looking for love, forgiveness, security, and hope.

At Saint Michael Lutheran School, our mission is to educate children and touch families' lives with the love of Jesus Christ. We provide parents with a strong Christian support network in a school-home partnership that assists them in fulfilling their responsibilities.

To maintain the quality of our school, every five years we must go through a self-study and evaluation process that culminates with a visit from an outside team of educators. For the next year and a half, the staff will be working with seven different school quality factors. An accreditation team of SMLS staff, parents, board and

church council members has been created to complete required surveys and accumulate examples of how Saint Michael fulfills all criteria for renewing our accreditation. Thanks in advance for your willingness to submit your input.

Larry and I were Santa and Mrs. Claus in Moca, one of our newer sites. These children were selected by the principal to attend the party where they received gifts donated by HABA. Each had a picture taken with us. It was a wonderful day. We also met the mayor and later that day were Santa and Mrs. Claus at the park in front of the City Hall. There is a tiny permanently constructed building where we sat for 2 hours and saw about 200+ children. It was not planned that we saw so many children, but when they heard about Santa, parents who were in line called their friends. The children were all so cute. On the last evening we met Congressmen Martinez and his wife. This was a real honor as he was one of the original supporters 20 years ago.
