Welcome Vicar(?) Colton LaMay

On August 20-24, Colton and I will be heading up to Saint Louis and Concordia Seminary as we start this adventure called the **Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP) Program**, a four-year, state of the art distance education program that prepares men for specific pastoral ministries in The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod. Using online classes, readings, meetings with fellow students (called a "cohort"), and mentoring by me, Colton will receive the majority of his training and preparation here at Saint Michael even as he continues to serve as our Director of Music Ministries. (There are 16 courses taught in an online learning community, including a one week on-campus intensive course each year).

Now, just so you know, Colton has already been hard at work preparing for our trip to Saint Louis. He has received approval and been given an agreement of support by our Board of Elders, the Church Council, and me (as his mentor); he has been interviewed and approved by our District Committee and recommended by our District President Rev. Dr. Greg Walton; and he has prepared for and passed the three entrance exams on Old Testament, New Testament, and Lutheran Theology and has been accepted into the SMP program by Saint Louis Seminary.

But the question some of you may be thinking is, why this move and why now? Well friends, having been blessed to serve here for 27 years, one of the responsibilities that I, and the Board of Elders, have is to think about and prepare for the future. So, an annual topic that we have been discussing over the past 5 years is succession planning. You see, in a long-term pastorate, we all (including myself) can get lulled to sleep with the passing of time; we can start to subconsciously think, 'Tomorrow will be like today, only more so'. But the reality is, every pastor is an "interim" pastor, which means every pastor only serves for a specific period of time (not for forever). And so we need to prepare for that inevitable moment because we want that transition to feel more like the passing of a baton in a relay race rather than an abrupt change.

What the Elders, our Administrative Staff, and I have been learning together is that the culture of a church, its DNA, its unique way of doing ministry and being together (like worship, leadership, relationships, and ministry to our community), takes years to build. And one of the greatest threats to the culture of a church is a senior pastor change. So we want to be wise as we approach this in the years to come. We will continue to study and prepare for the "inevitable" whenever that may happen, which is years away but not a decade away.

The Elders currently have two Task Forces working to gather more information to assist the Administrative Staff, the Church Council, and congregation, but all felt that having an additional ordained clergy on staff now would be a wise move at this time. Some of you may not know that Colton was actually accepted at Fort Wayne Seminary in

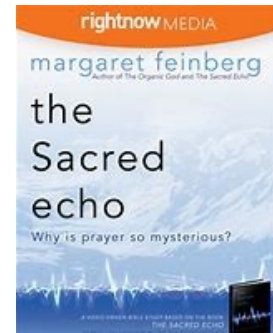

*From the Director of Caring Ministries**Julie Berchtold***The Root Cause of Worry, Anxiety and Fear**

Worry, anxiety, and fear are the same thing. They're the same emotion, just experienced on different levels, like stair steps. Fear is a negative emotion caused by a real or perceived threat to our well-being. Anxiety means being uneasy and nervous about something we can't control—an event, person, or problem. Worry is to mentally dwell on difficulty or trouble. This chronic concern is the lowest level of the emotional staircase.

The first step is worry. Worry turns to anxiety. Anxiety becomes fear. Scripture commands us not to do any of those things. Don't worry. Don't be anxious. Do not fear. God would never command us to do something if we didn't have the ability not to do it.

As a kid, I was always worried. My life was filled with fear and anxiety. You wouldn't have known it, because I carried myself with confidence. But deep down, I had emotional problems. Those problems turned into fear when I entered the ministry: Fear of men, fear of failure, fear of rejection, anxiety about everything. Even though my church was thriving, my life was filled with fear.

The root of all fear, anxiety, and worry is an orphan spirit. God was my Father, but I didn't know it. I didn't know He was taking care of me. I didn't understand how much He loved me—and how much He loves being our Father. Like an orphan, I had no idea who my Father was. Today, I'm both a father and a grandfather. My grandkids call me Pappy, and I love being their Pappy. They are never a bother to me. One of the greatest joys of my life is when they ask me to do something.

God wants our lives to be free from worry, anxiety, and fear because these emotions distract us from God. They rob us of our families and joy. And yet we are in complete control of them. Worry and anxiety exist only because we allow them to. How do we overcome them? First, we have to consider these thoughts to be agents of the enemy. They have been planted in our lives by the devil. Every morning, when you wake up, treat worry, anxiety, and fear like your enemies.

Second, turn every anxious and worrisome thought into a prayer until you find victory. Tell God, "This is what's bothering me today." Transform your worry list into a prayer list. ***"Be anxious for nothing, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God" Phil. 4:6.***

Third, confess that God is your loving Father and He cares for you. Let go of your orphan spirit. Orphans are on their own and have to take care of their own problems. But we are not orphans! Start rejoicing that you have the best Father in the universe.

Well-fathered children are fearless children. That's why God tells us not to fear, not to be anxious, and not to worry. He is the answer to every problem, and like a loving, gracious Father, He has promised to take care of us.

A Letter from Amigos en Cristo & Pastor Robert Selle

Amigos en Cristo Lutheran Mission Needs Help

In 1997, Donna and I returned from 14 years of missionary service in Venezuela. At that time we were called by the LCMS churches of Southwest Florida to serve as missionaries of the Gospel to the growing number of Hispanic immigrants living in our communities. So far we have ordained six new church workers, established three ethnic churches, annually provide emergency food to thousands of low income Immokalee farmworkers and provide legal immigration services to 1,400 families each year. These are life changing encounters and are the first exposure these immigrants have to the Lutheran Church.

We need your financial and prayer support if we are to continue. During this summer, we have experienced a shortfall of \$15,000 per month. This is not sustainable. If this continues we will have a year-end shortfall of \$80,000.

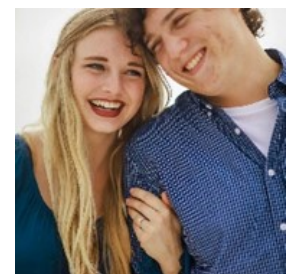
