From the Pastor

"Blessed to be a Blessing"

"Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever." (Psalm 106:1) Who would have thought in 1998, when we began our work in the Dominican Republic that God would do such amazing, great things from such humble beginnings? At a recent leadership meeting it was reported that many new opportunities are starting to take shape. With the seminary students able to assist in ministry in new locations, more and more people are being touched by the Holy Spirit with the good news of God's grace and forgiveness in Jesus.

The school, seminary, seminary housing, and the Good Shepherd Home (for children with developmental disabilities) in Palmar continue to grow. Our church in Santa Domingo, and our newly built and dedicated Church and School in Licey are reaching out in their communities. New opportunities continue to be presented. In Ozama, Pastor Sergio Maita and Vicar Isaac Machado (both Venezuelans), are reaching an ever growing Venezuelan refugee community outside of the capital.

Saint Michael continues its strong support of current ministries as well as venturing into new opportunities that we pray will pave the way for our missionaries and seminarians to follow where we are building new relationships. Here are some of the most recent highlights and opportunities:

- \$8,250 is wired every quarter for our support of our school in Palmar (in a building we funded on land we bought and donated). So far this year, \$24,750 has been sent.
- We sent an additional \$2,500 in April to help put a roof, windows, and doors on the newly ordained Dominican Lutheran Pastor Idjon's house in Palmar (he needs to live in the community rather than traveling every day from Santiago)
- Our most recent mission team's summer trip served in Palmar, Licey, and Moca
- We continue working with Mayor Martinez of Santiago in sponsoring 20 children learning English (going into their third year of a four year program). The English language school has invited our missionaries to be their school "chaplain".
- We sponsor 20 adults from the Mayor's office, Police, and Firefighters (going into their second year). We work with the Fort Myers Fire Department and Lee County Sheriff's Department for practical training and donation of materials. This has led to numerous opportunities to witness to our faith and provide an open "door" for our missionaries in the Dominican Republic.
- We will again be doing a Christmas run, bringing gifts and the true meaning of Christmas the birth of our Savior to our schools in Palmar and Licey, plus outreach opportunities in Moca and up to 300 children at City Hall in Santiago!

As you can see, there is a lot going on! And we can only do that with your help and support. For those of you with a love for children – you can designate your support to that particular aspect of our work in the Dominican. It is our hope, that with enough support, we can alternate sponsoring children and then adults at the English language school every other year, as well as continuing our strong support of our established schools, churches, and outreach opportunities.

Our next sponsored class will be children. We are working with the Mayor's office to have a contest in 10 schools where students will be challenged to find a way to serve in their community – to "Do Good". Each school will then choose one of their own who has served in that way to be our scholarship recipient. What an exciting way to spread the idea of serving!

Lessons From a Basketball Coach: The Value of Selflessness

How the high school coach of NBA star LeBron James teaches his players about the value of serving others. By Dru Joyce II

From the instant we leave our mothers' wombs, our needs are somehow magically met. If we cry, we get a bottle; if we soil our diapers, someone changes them; even if we have to burp, someone is miraculously there to make sure we get every last drop of air out of our little tummies. These are nature's guidelines, of course, because newborn babies certainly can't take care of themselves.

The problem is that as we grow up, we cling to these guidelines. We get used to other people doing things for us, used to wanting someone else to do the dirty work, and (metaphorically) crying when something doesn't go our way.

Heart of a servant

When people step away from the habit of "taking" and enter the space of "giving," I believe they become not only more fulfilled but healthier spiritually. Giving back is like a statement to the heavenly Father that says, *Thank you for what you've given me.* It's like a nod of gratitude combined with a battery pack that energizes possibility for someone else.

As a coach, it was always crucial to me that my players understood the value of having the heart of a servant. I needed them to see the merits of self-sacrifice, not just because it would help them become better players, but more so because it would compel them to become great individuals.

During the holiday season, a local church created food baskets for needy families. It may not sound like a major feast, but the labor that went into making these baskets and getting them to the right places was beyond tedious and took a lot of time and energy. *Time and energy* — these are building blocks of servanthood.

The boys and I helped unload tractor-trailers full of fifty-pound bags of potatoes and cases of canned goods. Do you think a bunch of teenage boys wanted to do this type of labor? We all know the answer. Sure, I'd hear the occasional grumble or wisecrack, but I knew at the end of the day, they were glad they had helped out.

These moments injected them with a sense of empathy for the needy families that would benefit from their diligence, and it also gave them quality time to bond as a group off the court, when they could tap into other aspects of life that were just as important, if not more so, than their own basketball-related desires and goals.

Teaching selfless basketball

I firmly believe it's about the team and not just an individual player. I remember driving LeBron James home from practice one evening, and I told him if he shared the basketball, teammates would always enjoy playing with him. I never had to have that conversation with him again. He got it. When your best player creates opportunities for other players, it becomes contagious. This selfless style of play has been emphasized with every team I've ever coached.

One of my favorite John Wooden expressions is this: "It's amazing how much can be accomplished when no one cares who gets the credit." This idea, too, belongs in the discussion of what it means to have a heart of a servant, because when someone is overly concerned with getting the credit or receiving the glory, it's usually a strong indication that they're only really there to serve *themselves*.

Players do this for all kinds of reasons—recognition, popularity, and competitiveness, to name just a few. A lot of seniors will play hard just to get scholarships. But the truth is that if you win a state championship *as a team*, you'll ultimately get everything you want as an individual and more. This is why it's crucial to always put the team first. Everyone, from coach to player, needs to operate with the common understanding that we are bound by commitment and fueled by our collective goal.
