From the Pastor

We are taking this year to look at our ministry past, present, and what it might look like in the future. And although things are constantly changing, there are some things that remain the same – and one of those is the mission of the Church! Specifically, Jesus calls us to make disciples, as we like to

say, "To draw people to God's love for them in Jesus and empower them to become fully devoted followers of Christ."

So, what does that look like? Well, here is how we might describe and define people who are becoming those "fully devoted followers of Jesus" by using these 5 "G" words:

- Grace A follower of Jesus begin their adventure with the touch of God's grace and forgiveness that they receiver through faith. What a gift from God to do what we cannot do for ourselves to be declared righteous in His sight because we have been redeemed by Jesus. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
- **Growth** The Holy Spirit in a believer changes their life and priorities and empowers, enables, and equips them to live their life for Jesus and to follow His example (2 Peter 3:18; 2 Corinthians 5:14-15)
- **Group** Participation in the Body of Christ (the congregation) in regular worship and Bible Study and fellowship where significant relationships can develop with other followers of Jesus. (Acts 2:46)
- Gifts Every believer in Jesus has been given a gift of grace (a passion, experience, talent, ability) for the good of others, to serve and love our Savior as we serve and love those around us, in order to build up the Church (Romans 12:6-8).
- Good Stewardship We honor God with our material resources and support the mission and ministry of our family of faith by managing and stewarding God's blessings so we can give a percentage gift to our common ministry work together, but also share in offerings (support of other ministry opportunities) as well as alms (gifts given to meet specific caring needs of those around us). (Philippians 4:11-19)

I think these statements capture the essential marks of someone devoted to Jesus and to His Church. These characteristics are Biblical – they haven't been invented or made up. And so it is my fervent prayer that we will use these 5 "G"s as a guide to making 2020 a spiritually significant year at Saint Michael as we all grow in becoming fully devoted followers of Jesus so others may see Jesus in us!



Thoughts from Jimmy Evans, Founder & CEO of Marriage Today

Priorities. We talk about them a lot, but do we really understand them? More importantly, does the way we live our lives reflect the things we say are our priorities? Our priorities are our values. The person who gives priority to God values God. The person who gives something priority above God values that thing more highly than God. It is that simple.

The Bible is crystal clear about our priorities: Put God first.

Matthew 6:33 spells it out for us. Jesus says, "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you." Jesus



But what does this mean for our marriages and families?

Establishing priorities in our lives and homes is a high-stakes issue. It's the difference between being blessed or battered, intimate or enemies, a success, or a statistic. And it doesn't happen by accident. Successful marriages are purposeful about their priorities, and they structure it into their lives. They arrange their decisions, practices, and lifestyles to reflect it. Honor God first. Then honor your spouse and family.

You may have heard something like the old adage that says, "The road to ruin is paved with good intentions." The intent is fine, but it has to unite with the willingness to make difficult choices. It must be accompanied by a readiness to say no to competing demands. Until we follow up on intent with action, we won't find the blessing and harmony we're looking for.

Husbands, how does your life reflect your priorities? When your wife looks at the way you live, does she conclude that you are living for God or living for something else? Does she feel like you pay more attention to your work, your colleagues, your email or your phone than you do to her?

Wives, what does your life say about your priorities? Does your husband look at you and see someone distracted by friends and activities and Facebook? Someone whose mind is pulled toward work or selfish pursuits rather than home? Someone who seems to be negative more than positive?

Are you ready to put God first in your life and make your marriage a real priority? Where are you giving your best? If you are investing in the wrong place, repent before God and your family. I pray that in 2020 your commitment to God and your family would be at a consistent, all-time high. Make a change. Re-prioritize, because the rewards far outweigh the cost.
