Fathers' Day – June 20

Someone once said, "I think what makes a 'father' a 'dad' is the act of demonstrating love in tangible ways to his children." There are 3 great gifts that Dads give: (1) They help lay a strong spiritual foundation for their children to build their lives on, helping them to grow, helping them to know, love, and serve Jesus, as well as how to pattern their life after the wisdom in God's Book, the Bible. (2) They help their children develop a healthy self-esteem. (Spiritually, a "God-esteem" – the value God has placed on them, that they are worth the very life of Jesus!) That image is reinforced by affirmation, positive reinforcement, and encouragement. (3) They give their children a proper understanding of the concept of love – that there is one person who is absolutely, irrationally committed to them. They need to know if they were in a line-up of a million other kids, and you could pick only one, you'd pick them every time!

So, Dads, don't give your children left overs; don't give them a worn-out, exhausted father that doesn't want to hear it, play with it, or be bothered by it. Commit yourself to being irrationally involved in your children's lives! **Happy Father's Day!**

What Are These Things Called "Calls"?

I thought it might be helpful to share just a few thoughts about the **call process** in our church body (The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod). When a congregation or school has a vacancy (they need a teacher, pastor, principal, worship leader, or DCE) or they determine that their ministry requires additional staff, they may or often enter into this "call process". Members of that congregation are invited to submit names of individuals they know who have the gifts, abilities, and experience to fill that congregation's ministry needs. And every pastor, principal, teacher, worship leader, and DCE throughout our church body is essentially available to be considered. A list is also requested from, and given by, the District executive who has a wider knowledge of different workers' gifts, abilities, and experiences, as well as knowing the calling congregation's ministry needs.

The calling congregation or school then considers these names. Sometimes the individual being considered is interviewed on the phone or in person in order to get more information directly from them concerning their God-given gifts, abilities, and experiences, their vision and practice of ministry, etc. And then after a great deal of discussion and prayer by the calling committee and the church or school, one person is extended a call.

As you can see, often a church worker is unaware that their name is on a call list or that they are being considered for a ministry position at another church or school. But once

they receive the call, in essence they really have to choose between the call to stay and the call to go, wrestling where they can best serve God in His Kingdom.

A second area of interest to you might be your role in this process. With the called person, you share in the deliberation/decision process with your own soul searching and prayer that the Holy Spirit may guide us all to know and do His will. It is helpful to share your thoughts and concerns about the ministry of Saint Michael, the challenges and the dreams. Your counsel, prayers, and observations are important.

The decision to accept or decline a call is one that is made after a great deal of prayer, counsel, deliberation, and personal wrestling with the will of God. It is not based on whether it's a step up/down, higher salary, closer to "home", better weather, nicer house, etc. It is based on where a person can best serve God in His Kingdom with the gifts, abilities, and experiences God has given them for ministry.

Please keep Jack Proctor in your prayers as he has received a call to Concordia Lutheran Church and School in San Antonio, Texas.

The Equality Act - A Word from our Synod and District Presidents

Synod President Harrison, District President Walton, as well as our Lutheran Legal Counsel Rusty Huseman have shared information regarding this proposed legislation and our need to add our voices in the marketplace of opinions and to share our opinions with our elected representatives. There are several links on the Front Page of the District website – <u>www.flgadistrict.org</u> – including a sample letter which can be used to address our representatives in the Senate.

Here is an excerpt from Synod President Harrison's article: "The church's task is not political; it is the proclamation of the Gospel of free salvation in the cross and resurrection of Jesus for all. God rules His church by His infallible Word, the Holy Scriptures. God rules the state by His eternal law, reason and reasonable laws for the common welfare. The church should not meddle in government affairs, especially matters upon which the Word of God is silent. It is also wrong when governments act against God's eternal law, reason and the basic civil rights of all people. The Equality Act is before Congress. It sounds innocent. All Americans should enjoy equality and the protections of the U.S. Constitution. But in elevating sexual orientation to a protected class, the Equality Act will bring sweeping changes to current laws, to the great detriment of the religious and constitutional freedoms of biblically faithful churches, institutions, Christian schools and individuals. We encourage all LCMS people to: (1) Treat all people with kindness and respect, while holding firmly to the 'faith once delivered to the saints.' (2) Become informed about the Equality Act and the issues of gender dysphoria. (3) Consider your role as Christian citizens and make your voice known to your elected officials, particularly in the U.S. Senate. (4) Pray for our officials, government and the church in these challenging days. 'Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil for evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. (1 Peter 3:8-9)"

How Can I Break a Porn Addiction?

My first exposure to pornography was in sixth grade. And I still remember it 35 years later. Can you remember your first exposure? As a conference speaker and pastoral counselor, I've asked that question hundreds of times. Everyone has an answer. Many confess they've struggled to break the habit for years. If you or someone you know is struggling with pornography, here are some ways to begin breaking the addiction.

Admit your problem

Even if you felt remorse over your past use of porn, you've also likely struggled with a

slew of internal justifications: "I'm not hurting anyone." Or "I'm not really cheating." In Jesus' eyes there is no distinction between lust and adultery (See Matt. 5:27-28). You are hurting someone—your spouse and yourself. And yes, you are cheating. Confess your problem to God and another trusted believer.

Understand your longings

Porn provides more than sexual stimulation. It can be used as stress management or to help you feel wanted, desirable, or in control. To beat a porn addiction, you must understand the "benefit" porn provides you beyond the sexual fix. *Deep down, there is a need that must be understood and brought to Christ.*

Install barriers

Cancel your online-streaming services. Install blockers on your phone and computer. Give a trusted friend the password to your phone and the right to check it at random times. Or go old school and buy a flip phone. Take whatever steps necessary to give yourself the best chance of success in the future.

Find support

Shame often keeps us from receiving the help we need. But it shouldn't. Talk to a pastor, counselor, or another believer who can give you the support you need when you are at your weakest. If you find yourself struggling to break free from addiction, take heart. God's love for you is not dependent upon your ability. He understands your struggle. And He will help you. Victory is possible.

"No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it" (1 Cor. 10:13).
