Happy 80th Birthday, Saint Michael!

Some of you know the story of God's grace in the history of our Church and School, but that story is always a reminder that God works all things together for our good. Near the turn of the century, traveling missionaries visited and discussed the possibility of starting a congregation. The challenge was that no bridge spanned the Caloosahatchee, so transportation was by boat only.

It was not until 1931, and the completion of the Edison Bridge, that Lutherans renewed their efforts in this area. The city was canvassed, and worship services were begun with an average of 7 in attendance. In 1939, Rev. H.E. Hartmann (from Trinity Lutheran, Delray Beach) led a delegation of 38 Walther Leaguers to Fort Myers to call on 800 households. They helped organize a new Lutheran Mission. The District assigned a full time missionary in 1940.

In September 1941, Rev. Art Weber arrived to lead that small congregation. And on **September 29, 1941**, Saint Michael Evangelical Lutheran Church of Fort Myers was officially chartered as a congregation in The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. (The name comes from the Church festival held on September 29th in honor of Saint Michael and All Angels). Within 6 months, the members dedicated their first sanctuary on the northwest corner of Grand and Lafayette (a parsonage for the pastor to live in was also constructed next door).

By 1953, the little church was sold, and a new sanctuary was built on the southeast corner of Coconut and McGregor. In 1956, Kindergarten classes were begun (Happy 65th Birthday to our School!). By 1964, the school had grown to a complete 9-grade level elementary school.

Our final campus move came when our current Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall (now the Office Center) were built on the southwest corner of Broadway and Carrell in 1968. The Education Building followed in 1978. Since then, we have built the Anderson/Eichler Fine Arts & Athletic Center, bought the property to the south side of Spanish Court to provide parking and an athletic field, purchased and renovated what is now our Early Learning Center, built a large maintenance building, expanded the narthex, and renovated the sanctuary, including adding stain glass windows and hurricane glass.

As the oldest Missouri Synod congregation in southwest Florida, Saint Michael has had the privilege and opportunity to daughter 6 congregations: Good Shepherd (NFM), Zion (SFM), Grace (aka "Bethlehem" EFM) Trinity (CC), Beautiful Savior (LA), and the mission in the

Zion (SFM), Grace (aka Dominican Republic.

Over the years the Lord has richly blessed Saint Michael's congregation with a passion for people, for families, for education, for youth, for outreach, missions, and human care. We stand in the succession of that long line of people who loved their Lord Jesus and who were willing to serve others. **That adventure continues to lie before us!**
