# From the Pastor

# Rev. Jon Zehnder

At the end of this month, once again, we'll celebrate the **Reformation**. On the eve of All Saints' Day (called "All Hallows' Eve," our "Halloween"), October 31, 1517, Martin Lutheran posted 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. It was a call for "reform" and change against certain practices and teachings of the Church.

Out of the struggle that followed came a theology based on Scripture and a way of reading the Bible that shook medieval Christianity and changed the political landscape. Three phrases sum up the three principles at work in reformation theology:

• By Grace Alone means that it is ONLY through God's undeserved love that we are declared righteous – that God "sees" us as holy and faithful. The Medieval Church taught that they helped "make" people righteous. The Bible teaches that God alone saves us (Titus 3:5-7); we cannot save ourselves by our own efforts (the good things we do and the bad things we avoid doing – Eph. 2:8-9).

• By Faith Alone means that we only trust in God's promises to us in Jesus (a trust that is a gracious gift by the working of the Holy Spirit in us – believing in our hearts and confessing with our mouths that Jesus is our Savior, Rom. 10:9). Again, it is not by our own efforts that cause us to receive this gift of faith – not our finding, choosing, or deciding – it is God's working in us.

• By Scripture Alone means that only God's Word is our sure guide for faith and life, not any human teachings or traditions. As Christians who celebrate our faith in our Lutheran tradition, we like to say, "The Bible is the only source, rule, and norm for everything that we believe, teach, and confess."

The insight that freed and inspired Martin Luther was simply this – what makes us righteous is not our own virtue but only the righteousness God gives us as a gift of His grace. All other religions are based on a plan where a person needs to work their way into heaven. Christianity is the only religion based on what God has done for us in Jesus.

Because of Jesus, a God of grace promises to declare and accept us as righteous in His sight. Through faith we receive that promise. The Reformers called that "Justification by grace through faith." To really understand our Reformation heritage, we need to understand that the theological force that is always reforming us, and the church, is the powerful Gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus!

#### Some Lutherans from U.S. History

- Lutherans came to America seven years before the Pilgrims.
- The Statue of Liberty's creator, Frederick Bartholdi, was a French Lutheran.
- The first book translated into any Native American language was Luther's Small Catechism.
- The Liberty Bell was hidden from the British under the floor of Zion Lutheran Church in Allentown, PA.
- John Hansen, a Maryland Lutheran, was the first President of the Continental Congress, serving until George Washington was inaugurated.
- Frederick Muhlenberg, the first Speaker of the House of Representatives, was a Lutheran pastor.
- The second oldest U.S. military unit was formed by 137 men from St. John's Lutheran Church, Charleston, SC.


