Spiritual Gifts Key (Correlates with the score card on page 5.)

Spiritual gifts are not the same as talents. They are spiritual strengths God gives us for being a part of His work in the world. This assessment and the list below are tools to help you better understand the gifts God is expressing in you. We hope that this list provides a glimpse into the part God has for you in His body now. To learn more about spiritual gifts you can look at 1 Corinthians 12:27-31, Romans 12:3-8, Ephesians 4:11-16, and 1 Peter 4:10-11.

- A. Faith--The gift to trust God for what can't be seen and, pressing forward, to act upon the promises of God. (Romans 4:18-21; Hebrew Chapter 11)
- B. **Service/Helps**--The gift to identify and take the initiative to meet the practical needs of others in the church, freeing them to fulfill their own calling or to attend to personal needs or urgent matters. (Acts 6:1-7)
- C. Hospitality--The gift of helping others feel welcome, accepted, relaxed, and comfortable. (1 Peter 4:9-10)
- D. **Teaching**--The gift to proclaim and clearly explain God's Word in a manner that transforms the lives of others. (1 Corinthians 12:28; Acts 20:20-21; Romans 12:6-8; Titus 3:1-2)
- E. **Encouragement**--The gift to provide encouragement, comfort, reassurance, and support in ways that foster healing and wholeness. (1 Thessalonians 5:11; Romans 12:8)
- F. **Mercy**--The gift to detect the emotional pains of others; to feel compassion, listen to, and provide loving-care. (Luke 10:30-37; Romans 12:8; Matthew 20:29-34)
- G. **Giving**--The gift to cheerfully contribute material resources above and beyond a tithe to others and the church. (2 Corinthians 8:1-7; Romans 12:8; Mark 12:41-44)
- H. Leadership--The gift to instill vision and to motivate and direct people to be faithful to their calling and responsibilities. (Romans 12:8; Hebrew 13:7, 17; 1 Timothy 3)
- I. **Exhortation**--The gift to stimulate faith and promote Christian maturity in others. (Romans 12:8; Acts 11:23,24, 13:43, 14:22)
- J. Administration--the gift to design and effectively execute plans managing people, resources, and time in order to reach the long range goals and objectives of the ministry team or church. (Titus 1:5; 1 Corinthians 12:28, 14:28-30)
- K. Intercessory Prayer--The gift to pray for extended periods of time on a regular basis and frequently see direct results to those prayers. (James 5:14-16, 1 Timothy 2:1-2; John 17; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; Acts 12:12; Luke 22:41-44)

Introverted (1): They enjoy solitude, but it drains their emotional energy. Socialization is needed to "Recharge"

Extraverted (E): They enjoy being with other people, but socialization drains their emotional energy. Solitude is needed to "Recharge".

<u>Controlled (C)</u>: They prefer outcomes to processes and enjoy structure, deadlines, and checklists. <u>Spontaneous (P)</u>: They prefer processes to outcomes and tend to lose their checklists, but this doesn't bother them. They "go with the flow".

Intuitive (N): They like metaphor and imagery. They tend to understand complex ideas suddenly, without knowing why or how and are more interested in "what might be" versus what "is".

<u>Sensing (S)</u>: They gather info bit by bit, then focus on facts, data, and experience. They are more interested in "what is" versus "what might be".

<u>Thinking (T):</u> They make decisions based on "thinking". They focus on facts, data, rules, and procedures rather than how decisions will affect people.

<u>Feeling (F)</u>: They make decisions based on "feeling". They focus on how decisions will affect people rather than solely on facts, data, etc...

Our personalities shape how we respond to other people and to opportunities. Every single personality difference is celebrated, and valued by God because He has designed each of us with unique personality traits that suit us for different things.
