There was an article I had received years ago about a couple that had been married for over 50 years, and over those years they played a game. The goal of the game was to write the word "shmily" in a surprise place for the other to find. So, they took turns leaving "shmily" around the house, and as soon as one of them discovered it, it was their turn to hide it again.

They dragged "shmily" with their fingers through the sugar and flour containers; they smeared it on the dew on the windows and in the steam left on the mirror after a hot shower; one even unrolled an entire roll of toilet paper to leave "shmily" on the very last sheet. There was no end to places "shmily" would pop up – notes on dashboards, on car seats, taped to steering wheels, notes stuffed inside shoes, or left under pillows.

This couple's grandson wrote, "This mysterious word was as much a part of my grandparent's house as the furniture. It took me a long time before I was able to appreciate my grandparent's game. It was more than flirtatious; it was a way of life. Their relationship was based on devotion and passionate affection."

There's more to this story, you can google it if you'd like, but the secret to the "shmily" riddle is that the letters stand for "See How Much I Love You." That is what February 14th is supposed to be about, but that is exactly what the season of Lent (which begins March 2nd) IS all about! It is our God of grace's way of showing us how much He loves us!

Every time you see that cross or contemplate and ponder that sacrifice, it should remind you that God thought about you above all else. And if you would have been the only person on this earth, God still would've sent

Jesus to cover your sin so you could live with Him now and forever.

There is no greater expression of love. It was in light of that love that Paul could say, "If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but freely gave Him up for us all – how will He not also, along with Jesus, graciously give us all good things?" Come and celebrate that love God has for you and witness the word "shmily" scrawled across a cross and emblazoned in the morning light around an empty tomb.

Take a listen to Chris Tomlin's song, "Nobody Loves Me Like You." Part of the words of that song are, "Nobody loves me like You love me, Jesus. I stand in awe of Your amazing ways; I worship You as long as I am breathing. God, You are faithful and true; Nobody loves me like You."

Devotion on Hymn 843 - Forgive Our Sins as We Forgive

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

I pray blessings in Jesus for you and your family this Epiphany season! May Jesus, the Light of the World, bring you peace and joy as we grow in faith together in God's Word. As we approach the journey to the foot of the Cross alongside Jesus during the season of Lent, this hymn helps us understand forgiveness. Though not mentioned in the verses referenced in the hymnal, this hymn calls to mind the eighth chapter of John where Jesus talks about forgiveness. In John 8, Jesus proclaims that He will bring forgiveness of sin to people of each time and place,



and it wasn't received very well at the time. The people couldn't fathom forgiveness by His sacrifice because they had no idea what that kind of grace was like. The crowd dwindles as the chapter progresses, and at the end, Jesus is leaving a different way before the rocks start flying! It's hard for us to understand that kind of forgiveness as humans, but Jesus gives us His Holy Spirit, forming our hearts and minds to forgive as we have been forgiven. The Cross reveals the blazing light of forgiveness beyond our comprehension into the life of resurrection in Jesus! He brings forgiveness that passes all understanding, and by His Spirit, we forgive others as we are forgiven of so much each day. Praise be to God for His love through Jesus by His Holy Spirit and for joining us together as His children, that we may grow in His endless forgiveness and steadfast love.


MasterSingers Concert


