## From the Pastor

## Rev. Jon Zehnder

"I waited patiently for the Lord; He turned to me and heard my cry. He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; He set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand. He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God." (Psalm 40:1-3a)

Who knew that David went through a flood and then had to clean up afterwards?! As we continue to process this storm that we went through (and what it left in its wake), please remember that your crisis emotions and reactions are normal responses to abnormal circumstances. So first, continue working through them; don't deny them or ignore them or rehearse them, but "Pour out your heart to God, for He is our refuge." (Psalm 62:8)

Second, be willing to receive from others. (You know the joy you receive when you help. So, don't deny someone else that blessing.) Third, don't allow the Evil One to drive you into bitterness. As we move forward, may God grant us all the ability to focus on what's left and not on what was lost. And, here's the last point: rely on our Savior, Jesus. In His grace to us, our God has set our feet on Jesus; He is our solid ground, and He can deliver us and sustain us no matter where we are or what we're going through. He is our Hope!

Did you notice that, after David describes the storm he went through, he acknowledges that it was God who lifted him; it was God who set his feet on a firm place to stand, and then there's this: "He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God."

That verse reminds of me Habakkuk 3:17-19a where the prophet says, "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will be joyful in God, my Savior. The Sovereign LORD is my strength."

We have the opportunity to join David and the prophet Habakkuk in

singing a new song, a hymn of praise and thanks to our God, as we celebrate our **National Day of Thanksgiving on November 23 and 24**, Wednesday night at 6:30 p.m. and Thursday at 10:00 a.m.

order to set our overall ministry and mission direction. Here is that statement: "Reaching across boundaries to cultivate peace in Christ from generation to generation."

Two months ago, we explored the first part of that statement, "**reaching across boundaries**," recognizing that we live in a world afflicted by separations and divisions and have been called by our Savior to reach across those chasms because each and every person matters to our God. Last month, we looked at the phrase, "**to cultivate peace in Christ**," knowing that there are many wonderful ways we can understand and experience God's blessings of peace every day of our lives. Even in the midst of trouble, trial and storm, Jesus, the Prince of Peace, is with us, and He can sustain us and keep us in that peace.

The final piece of "Our Mission" is, "**from generation to generation**." This phrase applies both vertically and horizontally. Vertically, we pass wisdom, knowledge and the love of our Lord and Savior Jesus intergenerationally but also horizontally through time. The people of Saint Michael have ben reaching out for decades, and, God willing, we will continue to do so for many decades to come. We want to help equip anyone willing, regardless of their spiritual or physical age, to join in our mission of reaching out toward others.



## Director of Worship and Music

Saint Michael has hired Ben Ball as our new Director of Music and Worship. Ben is currently serving as the Director of Traditional Music and Worship and organist at New Hope Presbyterian Church here in Fort Myers, a position he has held since 2015. Prior to coming to Fort Myers in 2015, he served at churches in Maryland, North Carolina and Virginia. He earned a Master of Music degree in church music (with a dual major emphasis in organ performance and choral conducting) from the Conservatory of Music at Shenandoah University in Winchester, Virginia and a Bachelor of Arts degree in church music (with a dual major emphasis in organ and voice performance and a minor emphasis in piano performance) from Bridgewater College in Bridgewater, Virginia. While at Shenandoah



Conservatory, he also studied opera and composition and was the recipient of the Cooksey-Parker Excellence in Organ award for graduate level students. He has recorded two CDs on the Allen Organ (pipe-digital combination organ) at New Hope: *Hymns of Triumph* and *He Is Born*. He is active as a composer and arranger of new hymns and choir anthems along with his wife, Katie, who serves as one of the music teachers here at SMLS. ## From the Board of Elders



The Pastoral Transition Committee has approached the process of evaluating candidates utilizing the report produced by the Vision Framing Committee under the guidance of Pastor Jacob Hoyer. The output was produced during ten meetings over a twelve-month period. The committee included a diverse composition of a dozen members of the congregation and staff. This process was validated with additional congregation members at three "wet cement" meetings whose purpose was to affirm the direction of the process and conclusions reached. Taking these recommendations, the Pastoral Transition Committee has evaluated over three dozen candidates, approximately 30% of whom are congregational nominations. The

committee has completed a number of interviews and is in the process of scheduling more. The skills, values and congregational mission priorities identified by the vision framing process continue to be applied during the interview process with candidates in order to narrow the number down to a list of three to five candidates who we will invite to St. Michael for a campus visit. After the congregation has met with these pastors, members will participate in the final decision by voting for the next Senior Pastor.

The board of elders will continue to provide detailed updates on a regular basis as they prayerfully seek God's guidance throughout this process. Please contact Kelly Zinn if you have any questions at <u>kellyzinn65@gmail.com</u>.
