From the Pastor

Are you looking for a challenge this New Year? How about this one from Ephesians 4:1-2 - "I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." So, let me ask you: how are you doing on your humility development? Are you gentle-challenged? Patient-impaired? Are you kind of underperforming in the loving department? By the way, if that's tough for you to gauge, ask your spouse, children or a trusted friend.

The Apostle Paul reminds us that this pursuit can only be done as we are compelled by the love of Jesus, the One who came to be one with us, to die to redeem us, to make us His very own (2 Cor 5:14-15). We have been "buried with Jesus through Baptism into death in order that, just as Jesus was raised from the dead through the glory of the Farther, that we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4)

In the Scriptures, there is this calling for us to continually put to death whatever belongs to our old, earthly, sinful nature and to pursue this new life that we have in Jesus (take a look at Colossians 3, Philippians 3 and Ephesians 4-5).

Martin Luther said in his explanation of Baptism that this pursuit happens by daily contrition (Godly sorrow over our sins) and repentance; that's how our old sinful nature dies to sin and evil desires. It's how this new person that we are in Jesus emerges every day to live before God in righteousness, innocence and blessedness. It's how we are enabled to serve Him by serving others.

So, here's your New Year's challenge (if you want to take it on): what is Jesus calling you to die to if you're going to live for Him in 2023? Like most of our New Year's resolutions, willpower alone will not be enough; we have to replace old habits with new ones.

If you're looking for some new habits, let me suggest the example of the early church (check out Acts 2:42-44): they studied Scripture together; they prayed together; they gave, served, confessed and received Communion together; they replaced sinful habits with kingdom-of-God habits (where God rules by grace in their hearts and lives).

Brothers and sisters, that is our calling as the children of God. It is a life worth dying for! God's richest of blessings in this New Year!
