The Power of Passion

I was hoping the title might catch your interest! February is the month of "passion" with Valentine's Day, Grandparents' Day, but more than that it is the season of "the Passion," the season of Lent (starting February 22). Once again, we'll dedicate 40 days to ponder the reality of God's great love for us, a love that caused God the Father not to withhold His own Son but to freely give up Jesus to redeem us and cover our sin, and what we will discover again is this thing called "grace!"

Billy Graham's grandson, Tullian Tchividjian, wrote a book entitled *One Way Love: Inexhaustible Grace for an Exhausted World*. In it he shared some great thoughts:

- "The Bible is one long story of God meeting our rebellion with His rescue, our sin with His salvation, our guilt with His grace and our badness with His goodness."
- "Jesus paid it all so we are free from the need to do it all. Our identity, worth and value are not anchored in what we can accomplish but in what Jesus accomplished for us."
- "The Law reveals sin but cannot remove it; it prescribes righteousness but is powerless to produce it; the Law is impotent, offering nothing but condemnation and death. The Law, apart from the Gospel, can only crush; it cannot cure."
- "The Law serves us by showing how to love God and others, but we fail to do this every day. When we do, the Gospel brings comfort by reminding us that God's infinite approval of us does not depend on our keeping the Law but on Jesus keeping the Law for us."
- "Grace is one-way love and has the unique power to inspire generosity, kindness, loyalty and more love because it removes any and all requirements to change or produce. Grace is a gift, pure and simple."

God became one of us and intentionally suffered and died in our stead for the sins of all people. There is no greater love and no love story as moving. The message of Lent can be summarized this way, "God's demand is to 'be righteous;' God's diagnosis is, 'no one is righteous;' so, God's deliverance is, 'Jesus is our righteousness.""

As we began 2023, the challenge set before us was to know God better and love Him more this new year. Here's one last word from Tullian, "Once this Good News of God's grace, love and forgiveness in Jesus grips our heart, it changes everything. It frees us from having to be perfect; it frees us from having to hold it all together. In the place of exhaustion, we might even find energy." There is power in the Passion! During these 40 days of Lent, let us discover God's grace again! Lenten midweek services will be held at Saint Michael on Wednesdays at noon and 6:30pm.



The Worship Team rehearses on Wednesday nights from 7:00-7:45pm and leads the 10:45am blended service.



Organ Project

Dear members and friends of Saint Michael Lutheran Church,

Martin Luther said, "Next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in the world." We are embarking on an exciting program to enrich worship in our congregation and community through the beauty of a combination digital and pipe organ crafted by the Allen Organ Company of Pennsylvania. This instrument will enhance our music ministry, providing the backdrop for a robust worship service.

The current Klug & Schumacher pipe organ which has served our congregation faithfully was built in 1981. The console (where the organist sits to play) is failing mechanically and many of the ranks (or rows of pipes which make the orchestral sounds of winds, strings, horns, etc.) now require reconstruction. Advancements in technology and manufacturing of musical instruments have grown exponentially over forty years. Because of technological advancements, we are able to artfully blend digital components with the established "surround" sound of the pipes to honor the original craftsmanship while updating the components that will take us well into another forty years! The pipes you see in the sanctuary will remain untouched while the bulk of the work will be housed in wooden chests that blend into the existing configurations, maintaining a subtle effect that will not detract from worship.

Much like the gestation of a new human life, construction of the new manuals (keyboards), stops, pedals and amplifiers will take up to nine months. Please prayerfully consider giving a gift toward this project.

If we were to build a new instrument from the pedals up, we could expect a cost approaching \$3,000,000.00. Because we are integrating digital technology with pipes, we have a far more achievable goal of \$398,000.00. We will begin displaying charts from which donors may purchase a single key or a stop in honor of or in memory of someone (or simply to the Glory of God). We are well underway with this project with a seed money gift of \$100,000. We give thanks to God for this generosity in starting the campaign.
