From the Pastor

"In like a lion, out like a lamb..." It's interesting that we refer to the month of March that way, isn't it? It just naturally draws us to two wonderful pictures of our Savior, Jesus. He is called the "**Lion** of the tribe of Judah" in Revelation 5:5 to signify His strength, and He is called the "**Lamb** of God" in John 1:29 and Revelation 13:8 to signify His willingness to sacrifice Himself for us.

Our Lion and Lamb Jesus was willing to use His strength as God the Son to sacrifice Himself in order to cover the debt of our sins and redeem us. He and He alone had the ability to atone for our sins so that by God's grace we might be "atone" with Him again. What a Savior we have!

That is what we remember during this season of Lent (which began on February 22 with Ash Wednesday). Lent is the church year's springtime; out of the cold and dark of sin's winter (think northern climates) emerge people reborn to live new lives.

Easter is the oldest Christian season, but the observance of Lent appeared between 200-300 A.D. Originally Lent lasted 40 hours to remember the time Jesus laid in the tomb. Then, it was extended to 40 days to remember Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. Since Sundays were never days you would fast, Lent lasts six weeks.

Lent calls us to take time out of our schedules to think of Jesus' sacrifice on our behalf (because it was for our sins that He suffered and died) and to look back on the impact of our Baptism. As Paul reminds us in Romans 6:4, "We were therefore buried with Jesus through baptism into death in order that, just as He was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."

school responsibilities. It is my goal to involve student musicians more frequently in our worship services.

When looking at our church mission statement ("Reaching across boundaries to cultivate peace in Christ from generation to generation"), I ask you to momentarily focus on the "from generation to generation" part of the statement. - 3) Be required to offer a special piece in our worship services twice each semester as part of receiving the weekly lesson scholarship.

The joy of this is that it is a win-win situation. It benefits our church in worship, and it benefits the fine arts program of our school. I appreciate your support as we build up the Kingdom from generation to generation!

The *tech production team* serves through the manipulation of sound and visual components. We are always looking for folks interested in learning more about this ministry. Our *Grace Notes Handbell Choir* is currently at capacity. - Other areas of special focus: open to ministry through school partnership; possesses an awareness of challenges around intergenerational ministry and is passionate to overcome these challenges
