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From the Director of Worship & Music

Alleluia, alleluia! Hearts to heaven and voices raise: Sing to God a hymn of gladness, sing to God a hymn of praise; He who on the cross a victim for the world's salvation bled— Jesus Christ, the King of Glory, now is risen from the dead.

Happy Easter season! He is risen! He is risen indeed!

Your generosity overwhelms me! Thank you for your gifts towards the new organ fund! This is such an exciting project, and it has been quite interesting to hear all the stories of why you are giving to the project (either in memory or in honor of someone). As I write

this in mid-April, the campaign (which opened the last weekend of January) has reached a significant milestone, hitting slightly more than 80% of the total goal. This is an astounding feat when you consider that it has only been basically two months! So many of you have asked all kinds of wonderful questions and generally just wanted to chat about the organ project, and I love chatting

So many of you have asked all kinds of wonderful questions and generally just wanted to chat about the organ project, and I love chatting about it! More than several folks over the past few weeks heard me say, "Just wait until you hear the new organ!" I cannot wait to present to you the new organ when it arrives. Once we complete the total funding for the project, the contract will be signed, and then we will wait for about eleven months while the organ is custom built at the Allen Organ Company factory in Pennsylvania.

<u>New Organ Fund – Frequently Asked Question</u>

Several have asked, "Since the new organ looks so much larger than the current one, does that mean the maintenance cost of the new organ will be much greater?" The short answer is no. For the longer explanation: the new organ will retain about 50% of the current organ's pipework and mechanical structure. That alone means that the cost of maintenance on the new organ will be half of the current cost. The new organ will be more than 90% digital, which has virtually no cost after installation. We would have the ability to do digital enhancements and upgrades in the future if we choose to do so, but the cost of maintenance going forward will be minimal.

Thank you for all the support you showed to the kids involved musically in worship throughout Lent and Easter! It was so rewarding to have them offer their gifts in worship as well as for them to get to experience playing as a soloist in front of people. There is no greater place to obtain such experience than in a church, in my humble opinion. For most of them, this was their first time playing solo in front of a group. While they were nervous, they all did splendidly! I am planning many more instances to involve our students in the worship ministry of our church.

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Senior Pastor Succession

Where we have been: Starting in 2021, leaders of the church and school met with a ministry consultant, Pastor Jacob Hoyer, to help us understand the unique culture of our ministry, how we do ministry and how we work together. That enabled the church to develop a ministry position description and allowed us to understand the unique gifts, talents and experiences the next senior pastor will need in order to carry the ministry forward.

The board of elders worked hard and long to evaluate the 42 nominations they had received. As the list was narrowed down, top candidates were interviewed again. The top two candidates and their spouses were brought down for a visit to allow everyone at Saint Michael a chance to meet them and get to know them better before selecting one of them to call. The congregation walked together, starting on April 1, in daily Scripture and prayer regarding the call. The call meeting was held on April 16, and the congregation voted to extend the call to **Rev. Jon Thomas**.

Where we are now: Pastor Thomas, his wife Margaret and their daughter Isabella have been invited to visit again to make sure they have all the information they need about Saint Michael so they can prayerfully deliberate where God is calling them to serve in His kingdom (whether continuing at Saint John or coming to Saint Michael). After visiting, there is usually a two- to four-week time period where the called individual considers God's will (whether to accept or decline our call).

Please keep praying! Pray for unity, pray for grace, pray for guidance for Pastor Thomas and strength for both Saint Michael's and Saint John's church, ministry and members.
