From the Pastor

As we approach Father's Day on June 18, I am humbled in my attempts to imitate or even reflect the love, compassion, strength, kindness and forgiveness that our Heavenly Father shows to me (and also to all of you). In Jesus' parable of "The Prodigal Son" (also called "The Prodigal Sons" since both boys were disconnected from their dad, but only one chose to leave home; it is also called "The Waiting Father" since the dad is really the hero of the story), we find some principles that help us act redemptively when we are faced with a wayward child, and it reflects how our Heavenly Father deals with us. It is recorded in Luke 15:11-32 as the third of three examples showing God's love for those who are lost from Him: one out of 100 sheep, one out of ten coins and the two lost sons.

When you reread this section of Luke 15, notice that the father does not disown his sons. There is no trace of anger or retaliation; the father simply keeps on loving them and reaching out to them. The father also did not allow himself to be overcome with despair; he went on living. He didn't blame himself for his sons' actions or their choices, nor did he allow those things to destroy his life.

The father didn't chase his wayward son; he didn't pursue or hound him. He allowed his younger son to choose his path and to deal with the consequences of his decisions (in other words, he didn't rescue him). However, the father also never gave up hope. In Luke 15:20, we see the father constantly looking for the return of his son. Through it all, he kept on believing (and, I'm sure, praying) that his son would someday come to his senses and return.

Notice too that there is no evidence that the father said, "I told you so." He didn't throw his son's mistakes back into his face. Rather, he freely forgave his son and welcomed him back, throwing a party to restore his son's relationship with his older brother, the rest of the household and the community. He then even made the extra effort to reach out to the older son



to join him at his side in the celebration. That party and his older son's presence should remind us that parents and families need the support of others when suffering the pain of a wayward child.

Well, friends, there is a Father who loves like that; it is our Heavenly Father! This parable is a true picture of the love that God has toward us, His children, who so often stray, disappoint and miss opportunities to welcome the wayward home. This continued love, grace and forgiveness is ours for the sake of the Father's only begotten Son, our Savior, Jesus!

Remember the letters of "FAMILY" stand for <u>Father And Mother</u>, <u>I Love You!</u>





From the Director of Worship & Music

Praise to the Lord! O let all that is in me adore Him! All that has life and breath, come now with praises before Him. *Let the Amen sound from His people again; gladly forever adore Him.*

As we move into the summer months, I want to take a moment to update you on the Share the Music Scholarship fund. First, thank you for all your support! Our goal for next academic year is that we will offer a weekly lesson scholarship to a minimum of four of our music students. I have chatted with several students about applying for the program in the fall, and they were ecstatic about the opportunity to study with a professional in our community. I want to highlight one student who was blessed by the program which is only

in its first semester of existence. Many of you know Jacob Schwan who played at one of our Wednesday Lenten services and will be playing again soon. As a sixth grader this year, he committed to working weekly with Dr. Bryan Edgett whom you have heard in worship services many times here at Saint Michael. Bryan is a retired university music professor with a doctorate in trumpet performance, many years teaching professionally and experience playing both solo and with groups around the country. We would be matching other students up with similar professionals in the community. By becoming a part of "sharing the music," you would be investing in the future generation of musicians.

To be considered for a Share the Music Scholarship, students must

- 1) Apply for and audition with the fine arts faculty to be accepted into the program.
- 2) Have an accountability advisor with the private lesson teacher (to make sure they are making good progress and taking their learning seriously).
- 3) Offer a special piece in our worship services twice each semester as part of receiving the weekly lesson scholarship.

The joy of this is that it is a win-win-win situation: it benefits our church in worship, it benefits the fine arts program of our school and it benefits the future of music. If this is something you would be interested in sponsoring, please chat with me directly, or make an offering designated to "Acct #9105 Private Music Lesson Scholarship." I appreciate your support as we build up the Kingdom from generation to generation!

Where we have been: Starting in 2021, leaders of the church and school met with a ministry consultant, Pastor Jacob Hoyer, to help us understand the unique culture of our ministry, how we do ministry and how we work together. That enabled the church to develop a ministry position description and allowed us to understand the unique gifts, talents and experiences the next senior pastor will need in order to carry the ministry forward.


The board of elders worked hard and long to evaluate the 42 nominations they had received. As the list was narrowed down, top candidates were interviewed again. The top two candidates and their spouses were brought down for a visit to allow everyone at Saint Michael a chance to meet them and get to know them better before selecting one of them to call. The congregation walked together, starting on April 1, in daily Scripture and prayer regarding the call. The call meeting was held on April 16, and the congregation voted to extend the call to **Rev. Jon Thomas**.



Where we are now: Pastor Thomas, his wife, Margaret, and their daughter,

Isabella, have visited again, meeting with key staff and leaders to make sure they have all the information they need about Saint Michael so they can prayerfully deliberate where God is calling them to serve in His kingdom (whether continuing at Saint John or coming to Saint Michael). That deliberation usually takes place in a two- to four-week time period before we will hear what Pastor Jon Thomas has determined is God's will for him, his family and his ministry (to accept or decline our call).

Please keep praying! Pray for unity, pray for grace, pray for guidance for Pastor Thomas and strength for both Saint Michael's and Saint John's church, ministry and members.
