






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## From the Director of Worship & Music





This past summer, we took a huge road trip. To be fair, anything over fifty miles is a "huge" road trip in my opinion. However, while we were up North, I had it in my little nerd heart that I wanted to make time to go and visit the Allen Organ Company's headquarters and manufacturing facility in Macungie, Pennsylvania. It was an organist's heaven; there were organs being built everywhere! Some were in the beginning stages of conceptual drawings and plans; others were in the woodshop and not even looking like an organ yet; others were in the assembly room, others in the finishing room; others were being wired



with all the technological gizmos to complete the instrument and make it sing, and others were being crated to ship to their new homes. I was absolutely over the moon watching this all happen. We were receiving a personal tour of the factory by the vice president of the company (*left*) who graciously answered all my questions. One of these questions was, "How many employees do you have here?" He said, "roughly 150." Now, most of these

are very skilled craftsmen: master woodworkers, electricians, programmers, etc. I thought you would appreciate hearing how our organ will be built.

#### **Music and Worship Ministry Opportunities**

The **Sanctuary Choir** meets on Tuesday nights in the choir loft from 7:00-8:30pm and leads regularly in worship (alternating weekly between 8:00am and 10:45am) from September through May. Our first rehearsal is Tuesday, September 5. **Something new** this year is that this choir is now open to anyone in middle school or older. If you have a middle or high schooler who would like to sing, we invite you to join them and make it a family activity!

The **Rejoice Children's Choir** meets from 9:15-9:30am prior to being taken over to Sunday school on Sunday mornings. This group incorporates the basics of music along with hymns, psalms and spiritual songs to be offered in worship from time to time. Our first rehearsal is Sunday, September 10.

The **Worship Team** rehearses on Sunday mornings at 9:45am and leads the 10:45am blended service through a variety of hymns and contemporary songs.



Our Grace Notes Handbell Choir is currently at capacity. However, if you would still like to ring, please contact me to be put onto the waiting list or to be part of a second group (if there is enough interest). This ensemble meets on Tuesday nights from 6:00-6:45pm and typically rings once per month in worship.
