But, the theology that Luther stood firm on is the same theology that we continue to profess today: *sola scriptura* (Scripture alone), *solus Christus* (Christ alone), *sola fide* (faith alone), *sola gratia* (grace alone) and *soli Deo gloria* (glory to God alone).

# From the Director of Worship & Music

"Music is the art of the prophets and the gift of God."

— Martin Luther

Martin Luther truly understood how important music is and what it means for our lives. He knew how useful a tool it could be for teaching theology, praising God and lifting our spirits. He also knew that beyond all the ways that we analyze it—our desire to categorize, understand and label everything—it is simply a gift of God. As the hymn writer Fred Pratt Green wrote in his marvelous hymn, "When In Our Music God Is Glorified," "How often [when] making music we have found a new dimension in the



world of sound as worship moved us to a more profound Alleluia!" Please take a moment to read the full text of this hymn which can be found on page 796 of our pew hymnal. But, please read it during the prelude and not the sermon! It is truly a text echoing what Luther and Bach knew to be true of music hundreds of years before: that "all music is to be for the glory of God and the refreshment of our souls." Music (and especially the art of congregational singing) connects us in a way that nothing else can compare to. We all join in the community around us when we sing those hymns, psalms and spiritual songs. So, make a joyful noise! Those of you who were able to attend the installation service for Pastor Bass heard when, during the opening hymn, the roof was lifted off the sanctuary by everyone's glorious singing. It was electrifying to be there as those words lifted joyfully heavenward. That is but a pale imitation of the joy of the heavenly choir one day. Keep up the glorious singing!

So many of you have taken time to share your beloved hymns, songs and anthems with me, and I so appreciate getting to know your favorites. Please keep them coming at any time.

As always, we would love to have you join us as we lift our musical gifts together to glorify God! Please see me if you are curious about how you might become involved (even if not every week as we realize what a commitment this can be). If you play an instrument or sing and you are feeling a pull to become involved musically, please chat with me so that we can see where you can plug in as part of our music and worship ministry. # From the Faith Community Nurse

Dear friends at Saint Michael Lutheran Church and School,

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Early detection is the key to good outcomes and survival. Breast cancer is sometimes found after symptoms appear, but many women and men with breast cancer have no symptoms. This is why regular breast cancer screening is so important.

The American Cancer Society (2023) recommends that

- Women between 40 and 44 have the option to start screening with a mammogram every year.
- Women 45 to 54 get mammograms every year.
- Women 55 and older switch to a mammogram every other year or choose to continue yearly mammograms. Screening should continue as long as a woman is in good health and is expected to live at least 10 more years.
- **All women** should understand what to expect when getting a mammogram for breast cancer screening what the test can and cannot do.

# Breast cancer does not only affect women; men are at risk too!

Men and women should be familiar with how their breasts normally look and feel and should report any changes to a health care provider right away.

Talk with your provider if you observe any new changes:

- A new lump in the breast tissue, chest wall or under the arm
- Swelling of all or part of a breast (even if no lump is felt)
- Skin dimpling (sometimes looking like an orange peel)
- Breast or nipple pain
- Nipple retraction (turning inward)
- Nipple or breast skin that is red, dry, flaking or thickening
- Nipple discharge (other than breast milk)
- Swollen lymph nodes under the arm or near the collar bone (Sometimes this can be a sign of breast cancer spread even before the original tumor in the breast is large enough to be felt.)

We will have breast cancer awareness information and resources available to you in the narthex on October 7 and 8.
