

Waiting and Wondering to Christmas

Waiting and Wondering has been the theme of our Advent worship which has been preparing us for the celebration of Christmas. Waiting seems to be a theme throughout our life. According to a June 2022 article by waitwhile.com, Americans spend roughly thirty-seven billion hours each year just waiting. Ever since our fathers died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation." 2 Peter 3:3-4.





A Service of Lessons and Carols

Dear friends and family at Saint Michael Lutheran Church,

During this time of year, social norms set the expectations that we are to be joyful during the holidays, yet many of us are not. We may feel a sense of anxiety or depression from the busyness of the holiday season, and some of us are grieving loved ones who have passed. These emotions can leave us feeling overwhelmed and blue.



Slow down, and take a deep breath.

Give yourself permission to take time for yourself. Here are tips for practicing self-care during the holidays:

- Take time to sit quietly. Sometimes self-care can be as simple as taking a few minutes to stop, sit and breathe. Whether we can find five minutes or 30 minutes to take a break, it can make a world of difference for our well-being. Find ways to create alone time (pray, read or meditate). Take inventory on what really matters.
- Tap into a sense of play/relaxation. It can be easy to become caught up in all the logistics that the season requires, constantly ticking things off the to-do lists. Before we know it, the holidays have become less of a celebration and more of a chore. Put the list down, and take time to play or relax. Make the gift wrapping or decoration time fun, watch sentimental Christmas movies, read a book, have a cup of coffee with a friend or volunteer. Whatever it is, making this a priority can help bring balance to a stressful or lonely season.
- Care for the body. During the holidays, create personal wellness: get rest, eat a healthy diet and exercise.
- Practice letting go of expectations. Sometimes, the best act of holiday self-care we can give ourselves is to work on letting go. Work on letting go of the expectations we often set for ourselves at this time of year, fixed ideas created in our mind that might not match how life plays out.

As wonderful as the holidays are, they can still be stressful and cause us to be blue. Caring for yourself is essential to thrive mentally, physically and spiritually. Stay connected! Attend church service, join a small group and be in fellowship.
