From the Faith Community Nurse

Colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer diagnosed in both men and women in the United States. The American Cancer Society's estimates for the number of colorectal cancers in the United States for 2024 are 106,590 new cases of colon cancer and 46,220 new cases of rectal cancer. Overall, the lifetime risk of developing colorectal cancer is about 1 in 23 for men and 1 in 25 for women.

Regular colorectal cancer screening is one of the most powerful tools for preventing colorectal cancer. From the time the first abnormal cells start to grow into polyps, it usually takes about 10 to 15 years for them to develop into colorectal cancer. With regular screening, most polyps can be found and removed before they have the chance to turn into cancer. If you are age 45 or older, you should start screening for colorectal cancer. If you have a strong family history of colorectal polyps or cancer, talk with your doctor about your risk.
