He is risen! He is risen indeed!

So many folks jump from the glad shouts of "Hosanna!" on Palm Sunday to the triumphant statements of "He is risen!" on Easter Sunday. So often, the in-between—Holy Week—the shouts of "Crucify Him!" and all the pain and suffering are forgotten or become merely a passing mention. But in that suffering, in that total darkness and in that silence are where our sins are forgiven and where our new life begins. Katie penned the lyrics above back on Good Friday of 2020. It focuses on the phrase "in the silence." This silence goes two ways: Jesus knew what would happen and allowed it to happen without opposition, without fighting back but simply in silence, and the Father did the same from heaven. Either one could have called upon legions of angels for rescue, but both remained completely in silence. On this side of the cross, I pray we never forget this silence. My hope is that we will live each day as Easter people with the joy of Christ's resurrection and triumph over death always on our hearts and on our lips as people who belong to Christ alone!
