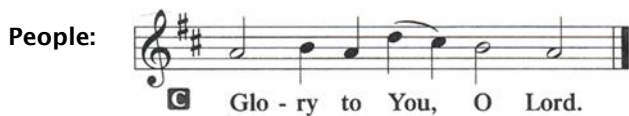

Lector: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the fifth chapter.

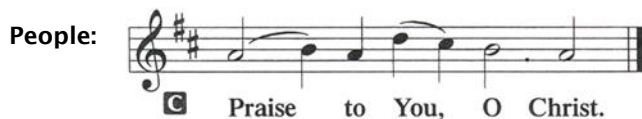


Holy Gospel

so freely shed for me.

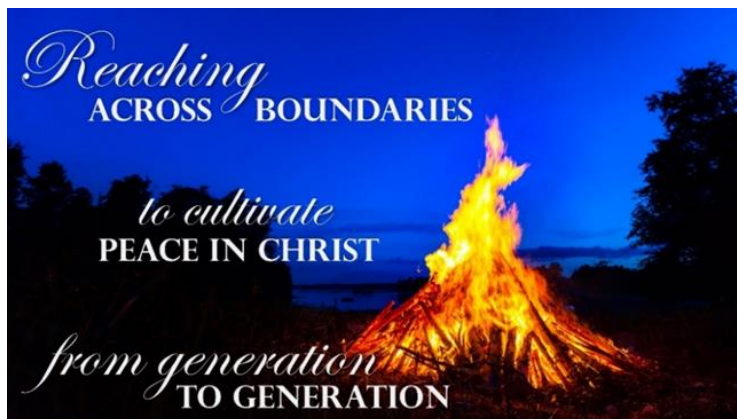
A heart resigned, submissive, meek,
